5. Jandakot Airport Update

5.1. MASTER PLAN

The Jandakot Airport Master Plan 2020 was approved by the Minister for Infrastructure, Transport and Regional Development on 22 August 2021.

5.2. AVIATION

• Runway 12/30 - Threshold is temporarily displaced for construction activities.

5.3. ENVIRONMENTAL - PFAS

- PFAS at higher than drinking water standards has been found in ground water outside the NW boundary of Jandakot Airport.
- JAH has contacted all adjoining residents not connected to scheme water to undertake a water use survey. JAH has offered to test the point of use water and offered water on short-term basis to impacted residents.
- The initial point of use water results, indicate a trend showing properties to the Northwest of Jandakot Airport could be impacted.
- JAH is working with Local, State and Commonwealth authorities to resolve the issue for the impacted residents.

- The consensus from the committee is that the communication to the residents cannot be faulted and updates are readily available.
