<p>6.1. MASTER PLAN</p>	
<p>The Jandakot Airport Master Plan 2020 was approved by the Minister for Infrastructure, Transport and Regional Development on 22 August 2021.</p>	
<p>6.2. AVIATION</p>	
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Pavement Management Plan is underway. • Next project is the northern runup bay will be pushed back by 12 metres. 	
<p>6.3. ENVIRONMENTAL - PFAS</p>	
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • PFAS at higher than drinking water standards has been found in ground water outside the NW boundary of Jandakot Airport. • JAH has contacted all adjoining residents not connected to scheme water and undertaken a water use survey. JAH has tested the point of use water and is providing water on a short-term basis to impacted residents. • A second round of testing will commence shortly on the northern western boundary. • JAH is working with Local, State and Commonwealth authorities to resolve the issue for the impacted residents. 	
<p>6.4. ENVIRONMENTAL – GENERAL</p>	
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Proposed Metropolitan Region Scheme amendment – for a change of use of the “sand mine” land adjoining the NE boundary of Jandakot airport so that it can be developed as a regional sports complex. Preliminary comments currently being received by organisations and councils, including Jandakot airport. Once preliminary comments have been reviewed, a report may be presented to the Western Australian Planning Commission.
