3.1. ATC Update	
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Jandakot Airport will commission the RWY12/30 extension and upgraded runway and taxiway lights in September. • CASA will flight test the new lighting on September 5 • Airservices will implement changes to arrival and departure procedures for aircraft using Jandakot Airport’s RWY 12/30 from September 2019. Noise</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • There were 12 complainants during quarter two 2019 which is a decrease from 16 complainants in quarter one. • Training affected 67 percent of complainants. The majority were affected by fixed-wing circuit training while one complainant was affected by helicopter circuit training. • General aviation traffic affected 42 percent of complainants. The majority of whom were affected by standard routes to and from the airport, while the remainder were affected by emergency services operations.

<p>4.1. MASTER PLAN</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The Jandakot Airport Master Plan 2014 was approved by the Minister for Infrastructure and Regional Development on 17 February 2015. • The ANEF has been endorsed by Airservices Australia. • An exposure draft Master Plan 2019 was sent to DIRD in December. DIRD Comments are currently being addressed. • JAH are awaiting feedback from Department of Environment and Energy in relation to the proposed change in use of parts of precinct of 1 and 2. <p>4.2. INFRASTRUCTURE</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • JAH has agreed to partial funding of the Karel Avenue Upgrade Project. The contractor has commenced work on site. Completion is expected in 14 months. <p>4.3. AVIATION</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Construction of the extension of runway 12/30 and associated taxiways is complete. • Replacement of the runway and taxiway lighting system is complete. • The overlay of the central and northern apron areas is complete. <p>4.4. COMMERCIAL</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Site 1 -An Agreement for Lease has been signed, for an office / laboratory building. • Site 207 -Work has commenced on a 10,000m2 workshop with a 1,500m2 office. • Site 216 - An Agreement for the Lease has been signed for a 1,200m2 office and 18,000m2 warehouse. This was previously proposed on site 512.
