7.1. WHITE PAPER, JET ZERO COUNCIL, NASG – David McMahon advised as follows: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The Aviation White Paper is due to be released in the first half of 2024. • Before then, a second round of public consultation will occur following the release of the green paper in the coming weeks. Information will be sent to the CACG Secretariat to distribute to the CACG. • A jet zero council has been established by Government with the first meeting held on the 15th of August 2023. • A few National Airports Safeguarding Guidelines are under review (Windshear, Windfarms, and Wildlife hazard management plans). A meeting is scheduled for Sept or Oct 2023. 	
7.2. PFAS- Tori Wright advised as follows: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • \$130.5 million funding has been allocated to the Commonwealth PFAS Investigation Programme for up to 37 Airports. • The funding covers: investigations, audits, health advice, management plan, tracking, further sampling (off-site included) and any additional steps. • Approval for any testing off airport is required from private property owners. • The department will contact residents or community groups (CACG) via the airport if testing is suggested in new locations. • The Department of Health has issued notices to the affected residents. • Testing completed: 3/8 detailed site investigations and 5/8 preliminary site investigations have been completed.
